The **Integrated History and future of People on Earth** (IHOPE) research network along with the **Mind and Nature** inter-departmental research node at Uppsala University are pleased to announce a call for papers for a student focused workshop on **Historical Ecology: The Next Generation** in Uppsala, Sweden.

Event Dates: November 12th-13th 2014

Location: Sunnersta Herrgård, Uppsala Sweden

This workshop will provide early stage researchers a venue at which to discuss their perspectives on human-environment interactions over the longue durée. Students in earth and social sciences and humanities are encouraged to share their own research applying aspects of historical ecological analysis. This workshop should be used as a platform for students to discuss and develop their research ideas; we welcome and encourage insights coming from work in progress. The event aims to generate conversation regarding the future of historical ecology as a theoretical framework for addressing connections and complexities between society, environment, and climate. The workshop will facilitate inter-disciplinary discourse amongst academics of all levels of experience interested in how the next generation of researchers hope to utilize or adapt the premises of historical ecology in assessing human-environment interactions. All attending researchers will share their own research to world leaders in historical ecology theory. One outcome from this workshop will be the generation of 50 key questions for historical ecology to be distributed by the IHOPE research network.

We ask that potential contributors and attendees register their interest as soon as possible as *spaces are limited*.
